The type of personal information we collect

We currently collect and process the following information:

- If you contact us, we may keep a record of that correspondence.
- If we contact you, your response may include personal information (for instance, email addresses or phone numbers) that we may retain, unless you indicate to us that you wish them to be deleted either immediately or at a given time.

In addition, our contractor, MailerLite of 548 Market St, PMB 98174, San Francisco, CA 94104-5401, United States, will retain information that you supply through a two-stage sign-up process for a regular email newsletter about 200 Magazine, promoted on our website – www.200livinghistory.info You are free to unsubscribe at any time, by clicking on the appropriate link in a newsletter, or by emailing the address above.

The only information requested or retained is your email address. This will be deleted if you unsubscribe.

This information is not held or downloaded on to computer systems belonging to the editor of 200 Magazine.

How we get the personal information and why we have it

Most of the personal information we process is provided to us directly by you for one of the following reasons:

- Seeking information or images about events relating to the magazine's core purpose, reporting the news from 200 years ago;
- Seeking information or images about events, books, magazines, visitor attractions, broadcast output etc relating to news or events from 200 years ago;
- Seeking to be added to the distribution list for email newsletters about 200 Magazine, or to receive the magazine direct.

We may also receive personal information indirectly, from the following sources in the following scenarios:

- Provision of information about potential sources of information or images.

We use the information that you have given us in order to produce content for 200 Magazine.

We will not share this information with third parties without your consent.

Under the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR), the lawful bases we rely on for processing this information are:

(a) Your consent. You are able to remove your consent at any time. You can do this by contacting the editor of 200 Magazine, see above.

(b) We have a legal obligation.

(c) We need it to perform a public task.

(d) We have a legitimate interest.

Your data protection rights

Under data protection law, you have rights including:

Your right of access - You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information.

Your right to rectification - You have the right to ask us to rectify personal information you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to complete information you think is incomplete.

Your right to erasure - You have the right to ask us to erase your personal information in certain circumstances.

Your right to restriction of processing - You have the right to ask us to restrict the processing of your personal information in certain circumstances.

Your right to object to processing - You have the the right to object to the processing of your personal information in certain circumstances.

Your right to data portability - You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal information you gave us to another organisation, or to you, in certain circumstances.

You are not required to pay any charge for exercising your rights. If you make a request, we have one month to respond to you.
